To whom it may concern:

As Executive Director of the State University Hospital of Haiti, I want to take this opportunity to extend my most sincere appreciation to the Eagles Wings Foundation, under the leadership of Scott Lewis, for being instrumental in restoring to working conditions the main emergency room building at the hospital following the earthquake of January of 2010. Coordinating crews of workers, the Pathfinder team rehabilitated our damaged primary entrance facility, the trauma area, a pediatric section, a pharmacy, and a lab area back into being our main resource. This operation has been an extremely important event for the medical community at the hospital and most importantly for our patients, since most of the medical care provided by the hospital after the earthquake has been taking place in tents. Yesterday alone, over 1,000 new patients were treated in the tent facilities highlighting the need for the restoration just completed by Eagles Wings.

Earlier in the week Eagles Wings coordinated the installation of a satellite dish at the same building. The satellite dish and its services, from Hughes Network Systems, was acquired and installed by ResponseForce1, with support by NetHope via Accenture. The activation of the satellite will provide communications capabilities that will allow the hospital to provide better care for our patients. Most immediately it will afford us capability of consulting with other medical experts worldwide.

I write this letter in commendation of the outstanding volunteer work done by members of the Eagles Wings Foundation, ResponseForce1, Hughes Network Systems, Accenture and NetHope who invested time, money and extraordinary effort following our catastrophic earthquake here in Haiti.
