13. Special Needs: In its first two hours, PTF uncovered 293 unmet special needs which already have been referred to case management specialists. PTF also projects it will not meet its 72 hour mission goal of completing human needs assessment for 60% of the local population. To continue operations, PTF will need more volunteers as well as a Task Force package with 95 personnel and 37 vehicles to support and manage PTF operations.

16. Remarks:

PTF IMT established a local registration center, a base, and a staging area. The IMT trained, oriented, and credentialed incoming volunteer responders. PTF then dispatched door to door Strike Teams into neighborhoods with 5 Strike Teams, 1 Special Needs Strike Team, and 1 Hot Shot Team.

As of this Sit Rep, 1,358 Survivor contacts forms were completed during a 2 hour operation period. Five Strike Teams went door to door through 5 neighborhoods logging needs assessment data at each doorway. Based on census tract info of 2 people per household (normal at 2.6 per house), the survey covered more than 2,500 homebound survivors. This equals over 1,250 survivors per hour. PTF also uncovered 293 unmet special needs which were referred to both Nassau County EOC, Coordinated Assistance Network (CAN), and the American Red Cross for follow up referral. PTF also dispatched one unmet Special Needs crews to begin to address uncovered unmet special needs. PTF responded to a special tasking from the local EOC to dispatch one Hot Shot crew to perform first pass debris clearing at the local hospital.
